BELIEFS


- Graduate students should be individually recognized and have personal contact with their Dean, Faculty and Mentors.
- All relevant post-graduate coursework from accredited institutions should be accepted for transfer. Students should not be made to retake courses because they have transferred from another university.
- Most post-baccalaureate coursework required for licensing and certification should be accepted for transfer.
- There is a need for doctoral degrees that are affordable, individually paced, possess academic integrity and allow doctoral candidates to continue to meet their other obligations.
- Graduate students should have the right to take post-baccalaureate courses at various institutions that serve their professional and personal objectives.
- Graduate students seeking degrees should be required to take, or to have previously taken, the traditional number of post-baccalaureate credits required by major universities.
- Students with professional maturity and relevant life experience are the best candidates to pursue graduate studies.

IUGS was founded in 1979 and is incorporated in the Commonwealth of Dominica, an independentent country that is a member of the British Commonwealth of Nations.
